Missouri Tobacco Quit Services are FREE, confidential, and an effective way to help Missourians quit all forms of tobacco, including e-cigarettes and smokeless tobacco ages 13 and up. The Maternal Health Access Project (MHAP) is a new statewide perinatal psychiatry access program to receive education and support in treating the mental and behavioral health conditions of their perinatal patients. Providers enrolled in MHAP can access same-day consultation with a perinatal psychiatrist, care coordination services, and educational materials and trainings on topics related to perinatal mental health. AAFP Survey: Consolidation in Health Care

The Government Relations team is collecting information about member experiences with health care consolidation, including practice acquisitions, hospital mergers, or purchases by health care payers or private investors. This information will be shared in response to a request for information from the Federal Trade Commission, Department of Health and Human Services, and Department of Justice on the effects of health care consolidation. The agencies are especially interested in how health care consolidation effects physicians and patients. We know family physicians witness the impacts of mergers and acquisitions up close and can offer invaluable feedback about the effects on the health care workforce, patients, and the local community.
