UMC Workforce Survey Announcement

Watch your email inboxes! The University of Missouri Center for Health Policy is conducting a survey this fall to understand better the characteristics of the physician workforce in the state. Invitations to participate in the survey are being emailed to a random sample of physicians across Missouri. Survey data will be used to assess practice locations, areas of practice, availability, and demographic characteristics of Missouri's physician workforce.

Child and Adolescent Health Groups Sound the Alarm on Mental Health Crisis

Last October, the AAFP joined the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and the Children's Hospital Association <u>in declaring children's mental health a national</u> <u>emergency</u>. One year later, the AAFP and our partners are calling for further legislative action to address this crisis.

Family physicians and their primary care colleagues play a critical role in identifying mental health conditions, ensuring equitable access to mental health care, and reducing the stigma of mental illness. Without family physicians, the nearly one in five U.S. adults who experience some form of mental illness each year may go untreated.

Advocacy efforts include:

• <u>Sending a letter to President Biden urging his administration to continue the work to address the youth men-</u><u>tal health crisis.</u>

• The AAFP is advocating for the Senate to pass the bipartisan <u>Improving Access to Behavioral Health Integra-</u> tion Act (S. 4306), which would establish a federal grant program for primary care practices to implement evidence-based behavioral health integration programs.

CMS Releases New Tools to Prepare States as COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Ends

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released a robust set of <u>FAQs and related guidance</u> that address the multiple queries that CMS has received. These FAQs provide guidance to support state efforts to unwind the continuous enrollment condition and other COVID-19 temporary authorities in Medicaid and CHIP after the public health emergency (PHE) ends. The FAQs address the following issues: the unwinding period; renewals and changes in circumstances; non-MAGI ex parte renewals; waivers; countable resources; premiums; fraud; and abuse among other issues. <u>Contact, Julie Harrison manager</u>, Center for State Policy at the American Academy of Family Physicians with questions.

AAFP Advocacy in Action

The CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices voted unanimously during its Oct. 19-20 meeting to add <u>COVID-19 vaccination</u> to next year's child, adolescent and adult immunization schedules. The ACIP also said COVID-19 shots should be included in the <u>CDC's Vaccines for Children pro-</u> <u>gram</u>, which each year provides millions of kids with free inoculations against a number of infectious diseases. <u>Learn more.</u>

Join Leading Physician Well-being Program

There's still time to apply for the 2023 <u>Leading Physician Well-being (LPW) program</u>, but the window to do so closes on November 4 at 5 p.m. CDT. Now entering its third year, LPW is a tuition-free certificate program that empowers members to champion well-being in their practice or organization by growing their knowledge and skills in three foundational areas:

1. Physician well-being: Participants build expertise through education about the current state and importance of well-being, how to measure it, and best practices to achieve it.

 Leadership development: LPW scholars learn to lead through wielding influence, implement change management and performance improvement (PI) activities, and communicate with medical colleagues and others.
Performance improvement: Participants develop and implement a PI-CME project in their practice or organization that meets ABFM Performance Improvement Activities requirements.

<u>A comprehensive FAQ</u> provides more information about the program, and a <u>tentative schedule</u> of next year's LPW activities is available.
